Marie and Johnny liked traveling together, going on vacations, eating out, playing dominoes, aggravation or rummy and sitting back doing a whole lot of nothing but enjoying one another's company. They loved to sit out on the back porch watching the squirrels and birds. Mrs. Moore thoroughly enjoyed taking her children, Joseph Jr. and James to their baseball games, band trips and Scouts. She had a Siamese cat that Jr. gave her called Wacky Weed. She had that cat for over 20 years which gave her a lot of joy, comfort and companionship. The cat had to be put to sleep and was cremated earlier this year. It was placed on the mantel where she wants to be placed. Marie and Johnny were both baptized back in the 70's and were added to The Church of Christ at that time. She loved Bible study and going to church. She and Johnny studied the Bible together and she loved to hear the Bible read to her.
